> We are a State agency. All of our employees are State employees.
> When we order hazardous materials, they arrive by common carriers. We are
> planning on a centralized receiving facility. The freight companies will
> arrive with materials and pull up to unloading points in a lot or at
> docks. At this point, their vehicles are no longer on public access
> roadways, rather, they are in parking lots or unloading areas. After the
> trucks stop, when the materials are unloaded, our personnel (government
> employees) may be asked to assist the truckers in the unloading (whether
> by hand, hand truck or forklift). For the purpose of the DOT regulations,
> would this activity, unloading only, be considered as "in commerce"?
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
